History in the making: The year we struggled through. Enough said. But so many good things happened. Soups were delivered to sheltering people. The Free Little Library changed out books for food. The above election inspectors studied up and did a fantastic job. Plexiglas panels allowed the Board to meet in person all year. November marked the 100<sup>th</sup> year anniversary of the Village beginning their incorporation apart from Town of Lyndon. The first try failed. They started the process over in 1921. Notice of "a meeting of the electors of the territory described" was published November 23,1922. On December 18, 1922, a poll list of 127 "persons voting at a Referendum Election held in The Town of Lyndon" was held at "T.H. Alcox Hall, Lot 1, Block 5, original plat of Waldo, in said county of Sheboygan." The Referendum passed and the first Board meeting was held January 24, 1923. After this challenging year, we yearn for gatherings and celebrations. This historical birthday seems like a good opportunity.

The Village is working with the Sheboygan County Highway Department to rebuild CTH V in Waldo from Highway 57 to the east Village limits. The street will be widened, and sections of storm sewer, curb and gutter installed. Information meetings will be held. The project is scheduled for 2022. A cross culvert at the intersection of Fourth and Lydon street was replaced.

### VILLAGE GOVERNMENT

Our current Village Board of Trustees President Gary Dekker along with Trustees Jerome Hammarlund and Chris Madgwick have decided to run for another term. The election is April 6, 2021. (There's also a Feb. 16<sup>th</sup> primary for the Superintendent of Public Instruction. (If other folks come forward to run for Trustee or President, then these contests will also be on the February primary ballot.) #### VILLAGE GROWTH

Six new homes are in progress in the Village. All lots in in the Homestead development behind the park have been sold.

#### DAM

The dam at the millpond was inspected by an engineering firm as required by the DNR every three years. Brush was removed by the Millpond Association on the north berm. Village personnel repaired eroded areas. The village is looking into cost sharing grants with the DNR for future improvements identified in the inspection report.

#### WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT

A pilot study using a rare earth metal for the removal of phosphorus was successful this summer. This will meet the DNR requirement to remove phosphorus from the effluent to low levels in the next discharge permit with the DNR.
