VILLAGE OF WALDO SHEBOYGAN COUNTY, WISCONSIN ORDINANCE NO. 2025-08

AN ORDINANCE TO PROHIBIT PARKING ON BOTH SIDES OF WEST FIRST STREET (STATE HIGHWAY 28), AND TO AMEND § 158-5 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE

WHEREAS, the Village Board of the Village of Waldo finds it necessary to regulate parking on West First Street, also designated as State Highway 28, within the Village limits to promote public safety, facilitate traffic flow, and ensure clear access for emergency vehicles; and

WHEREAS, the Village occasionally permits temporary parking on the north side of West First Street (State Highway 28) during special events, such as the annual Fire Department brat fry, with appropriate coordination and safety measures; and

NOW, THEREFORE, the Village Board of the Village of Waldo, Sheboygan County, Wisconsin, does hereby ordain as follows:

Section 1: Amendment to § 158-5 of the Village Code

The Village of Waldo hereby amends § 158-5 of the Municipal Code as follows:

§ 158-5. Parking prohibited at all times. [Amended 05-08-2025 by Ord. No. 2025-08]

A. Block 3 of the original plat commencing at the southwest corner of said block, a distance of 20 feet east along the north side of West First Street and a distance of 14 feet along the east side of North Harmon Street.

- A. Block 3 of the original plat commencing at the southwest corner of said block a distance of 14 feet along the east side of North Harmon Street.
- D. Any person who shall violate the provisions of this section shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to a penalty and shall, upon conviction thereof, forfeit not less than \$20 nor more than \$100 together with costs of prosecution and, in default of payment of such forfeiture and costs of prosecution, shall be imprisoned in the county jail until such forfeiture and costs are paid, but not exceeding 10 days.
- D. Any person who violates any provision of this section shall be subject to a forfeiture of not less than \$25.00 and not more than \$100.00 for each offense. Each day that a violation continues shall constitute a separate offense. In addition, any vehicle parked in violation of this ordinance may be towed at the owner's expense.

Section 2: No Parking Zone Established

No person shall park, stop, or leave standing any vehicle, whether attended or unattended, at any time on either side of West First Street (State Highway 28) within the corporate limits of the Village of Waldo.

Section 2.1: Temporary Exceptions

Temporary parking on the north side of West First Street (State Highway 28) may be permitted for special events as authorized by the Village Board or its designee, provided that:

- 1. The Cascade Police Department or other contracted law enforcement agency is notified in advance of the event;
- 2. Temporary signage is installed and clearly visible for the duration of the event to inform the public of the temporary exception;
- 3. The event organizer ensures that access for emergency vehicles is not impeded.

Section 3: Installation of Signs

The Department of Public Works is hereby directed to install and maintain appropriate permanent "No Parking" signage on both sides of West First Street (State Highway 28) in accordance with the standards set forth in the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD).

Section 4: Enforcement and Penalties

Any person who violates any provision of this ordinance shall be subject to a forfeiture of not less than \$25.00 and not more than \$100.00 for each offense. Each day that a violation continues shall constitute a separate offense. In addition, any vehicle parked in violation of this ordinance may be towed at the owner's expense.

Section 5: Severability

If any section, clause, provision, or portion of this ordinance is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this ordinance shall not be affected thereby.

Section 6: Effective Date

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force upon its passage and publication as required by law.
