

VILLAGE OF WALDO BOARD OF TRUSTEES  
MEETING MINUTES FROM  
MONDAY, APRIL 13, 2026

1. Call to Order:

President Travis Thomas called the April 13, 2026, Village Board meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

2. Roll Call:

Trustees present included Joshua Behr, Jerome Hammarlund, Dennis Reinemann, Michael Hintz, and Travis Thomas.

Village Staff present was DPW Mike Kitzerow & Clerk/Treasurer Lisa.

3. Certification of Compliance with Open Meeting Law:

Clerk/Treasurer Gillette confirmed the meeting was held in compliance with the Open Meetings Law.

4. Pledge of Allegiance:

All in attendance stood and recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

5. Minutes of March 9, 2026, Regular Board Meeting:

Trustee Hintz motioned to approve the Village Board minutes of March 9, 2026, Village Board Meeting. Trustee Hammarlund seconded the motion. The motion carried.

6. Public Comment:

Brian Wimmler stated that the Plan Commission made a good choice on their recommendation for the shipping container ordinance. Travis Thomas spoke on the Little Town in the Middle of Nowhere aka Waldo Wisconsin Facebook Group. He stated that the posts on that page generally do not make Waldo look good. That there have been some really not nice posts made and asked everyone to do better. The village has no control over that group as it is not an official social media page for the village. All notices and important information for residents will be shared directly from the Village of Waldo website and Facebook page.

7. Financial Report:

8. Pay Monthly Vouchers:

Trustee Hintz motioned to approve paying vouchers #DD1050-DD1056, 17028-17051; withholding check 17050 until Village President confirms the correct total with the company, and online payroll liabilities in the amount of \$105,230.79. Trustee Reinemann seconded the motion. The motion carried.

9. Reports:

a) Buildings Committee: None

b) Parks Committee: President Thomas reported to the board that it was reported that trees along the westside of the park snapped off during the heavy windstorm. He also stated that the signs need to be replaced with the updated park hours. Lakeshore ATV/UTV Club will help pay for the signs for the ATV/UTV route in the Village.

- c) Roads Committee: Trustee Hintz reported that Lawson street is in bad shape. President Thomas let Trustee Hintz know that Lawson is scheduled for repair this year.
- d) Police Report: March's report included: 3 citations, 8 warnings, 65 property checks, 5 complaints, 15 hours and 132 miles.
- e) Fire Department Report: The Fire Department reported 5 calls, all for wires down (none in the village), the fire department flooring will be started once it warms up, Tender 2 is currently being painted. The Fire Department sends a Thank You to all that attended the brat fry.

14. Ordinance 2026-04 Repealing Article VII 67-24 and Creating 195-15 of the Zoning Coded Prohibiting Shipping Containers, Portable Storage Units, and Storage Trailers:

Trustee Hammarlund motioned to table this item to amend it to be in agreement with the Plan Commission's recommendation of prohibiting residential use but allowing Industrial, Commercial, and Agricultural use. Trustee Hintz seconded the motion. The motion carried.
